

In the past two weeks you may have noticed that we are now singing the new mass parts, or Chants, of The Roman Missal approved by ICEL (International Commission on English in the Liturgy).

This is the official Mass setting for the Archdiocese of Boston and will be included in all English editions of The Roman Missal. All publishers are required to include this mass setting as the first option that appears in their missalettes and participation aids. Beginning in September, Cardinal Sean granted permission for all Archdiocesan parishes and Catholic institutions to begin a gradual introduction of the sung acclamations in order to more effectively introduce these new English texts, all of which must be implemented on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011. All parishes have been asked by the Archdiocese to teach the official Mass setting first before introducing other musical settings. Parishes who wish to use other musical settings may introduce them beginning in January 2012. Here at Saint Peter Parish the new chant setting will be sung through Advent. Starting in the Christmas season we will be using a different musical setting for the parts of the Mass.

**Parish Pastoral Council:**

## What It Means To Celebrate The Liturgy Part IV - THE OPENING RITES

For our purposes, the Liturgy can be thought of in four parts: First: the Opening Rites, Second: The Liturgy of the Word, Third: The Liturgy of the Eucharist, and Fourth: The Dismissal Rite. This week we look at the Opening Rites.

Some years ago, Bishop Roger Mahoney of Los Angeles, California wrote a Pastoral Letter to his people speaking of the importance of Sunday Worship. He envisioned what an ideal Sunday morning would look like for people. Interestingly enough as he talked about the Opening Rites, he did not begin with “when Mass starts”, he began with “when the day starts”.

He pictured people waking up and already starting to prepare for Sunday worship. He spoke of people not getting too involved in a project or the Sunday newspaper so that they then had to rush to get to church. He pictured people waking, dressing and being focused on getting to church. He further described people arriving early for church and beginning to greet each other in the parking lot. He spoke of a happy kind of “noise” in the church as people took their places. He envisions people coming to mass prepared for prayer and worship and bringing an attitude of expectation and joy. For him, all of these things that preceded the actual start of mass made a world of difference in the act of coming together as God’s people to celebrate the Lord’s Day.

The actual Liturgy usually begins with a word of welcome and an invitation to join in a Gathering Song while the Entrance Procession moves through the church to the altar area. The song is not meant to “cover the movement” of the procession or to separate the congregation (those who sing and those who do not). It is meant to unite the congregation together as one voice, raised in praise of God. It is an important moment when our separate voices now all join as one. Being one people of God is now evidenced over being many individuals sharing space. Hopefully we sing all the verses of the song chosen for this occasion – allowing “the poet to finish his/her thought, and the accompanist to color around that thought”. Then a formal greeting and welcome is extended from the Priest to the congregation, who respond accordingly.

Next, is the Penitential Rite. It is important that we think of what we say here. We admit to God and to each other that we are sinners, in need of God’s grace and forgiveness, and we ask the other gathered people to pray for and with us. There is humility and commitment expressed in the common need of our gathered community.

Finally, the priest prays the Collect Prayer. He starts with the statement “Let us pray”. The congregation gathers their thoughts prayerfully, and then the priest “collects” these prayers and offers them to God. We respond “Amen” that this too is our prayer. Then we are seated to listen prayerfully and attentively to the Word of God.


### **“Pass the Pasta”**
