I am happy to report to you what we learned about the progress of Pastoral Planning for the Archdiocese, at our recent Priest Convocation.

It is very clear to me that the Planning Commission has made every effort to listen and act upon what they have heard in the last several months. From 40 different meetings in which over 5,000 people participated, and from the parish homework pages (over 8,000 pages) so far submitted the Commission offers the following thoughts.

- There is broad-based support within the Archdiocese for moving ahead with the proposal. 84% of respondents prefer this over closing more parishes. 74% agreed that Evangelization and Outreach must be the long-term goal for mission in the Archdiocese.
- It has become abundantly clear that a phased-in approach (perhaps over a 5 year period) is the optimal way to implement the proposal.
- Assignment of pastors is a key factor, and there must be flexibility in the choosing and assigning of pastors – many factors must be considered. (This represents a big shift in the original wording of the proposal and represents what they heard at meetings.)
- Some of the proposed collaboratives do not represent the best possible groupings and will be reexamined and adjusted.
- Training for the Pastoral Service Teams is seen as absolutely critical.
- There was a realization that “one size doesn’t fit all” and that flexibility needs to be applied to this process.

The Commission also highlighted a number of concerns that they are still trying to resolve. These include: Religious Order staffed parishes, Language groups within a parish, the presence of a Catholic School in a parish, and a few other issues that need attention.

I would conclude then, at this point, that the process is moving ahead with a great deal of thoughtfulness and care. The Commission hopes to have a Proposal ready to present to the Cardinal some time this Fall.

Lastly please remember to use the resource 2012Planning.org. There you will find all the information on the development of the Planning Initiative, including the three talks that we listened to at the Convocation on June 7th. There is also a questionnaire that anyone is welcome to fill out and submit. Of course, we will continue to update you with any forthcoming information over the summer months.

St. Peter Parish has celebrated many sacraments throughout the year. Let us pray and recognize all of those who were baptized, married and buried from our parish since January.

Boston Catholic Appeal 2012

This annual collection is to the Archdiocese what the offertory collection is to a parish. It is one of the ways that we provide the on-going services of the church especially to the needy. This collection supports the many outreach efforts of the archdiocese – including the important work of Catholic Charities. (Did you know that the Archdiocese of Boston is second only to the State of Massachusetts in providing social services to the needy of our communities?)

This year our parish money goal is \$50,275 and our parish participation goal is 98 families/households. This goal is attainable if all parishioners will share responsibility by making a donation. **Please know that, unlike previous years, this amount is now a bill to the parish. If we do not collect this amount, we will have to make it up from parish funds.** If you did not receive an envelope in the mail, additional envelopes are available at all the doors of the church. Returns may be mailed directly to the Appeal Office. As of June 15th 76 families from St. Peter Parish have donated \$32,180. This represents 64% of our goal of \$50,275.
