Boston Catholic Appeal 2012

This annual collection is to the Archdiocese what the offertory collection is to a parish. It is one of the ways that we provide the on-going services of the church especially to the needy. This collection supports the many outreach efforts of the archdiocese – including the important work of Catholic Charities. (Did you know that the Archdiocese of Boston is second only to the State of Massachusetts in providing social services to the needy of our communities?)

This year our parish money goal is \$50,275 and our parish participation goal is 98 families/households. This goal is attainable if all parishioners will share responsibility by making a donation. **Please know that, unlike previous years, this amount is now a bill to the parish. If we do not collect this amount, we will have to make it up from parish funds.** If you did not receive an envelope in the mail, additional envelopes are available at all the doors of the church. Returns may be mailed directly to the Appeal Office. As of May 7th 60 families from St. Peter Parish have donated \$29,185. This represents 58.05% of our goal of \$50,275.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus gives us the great commandment to love one another as he loves us and reminds us that there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for a friend. In this spirit, please prayerfully consider a sacrificial gift to the 2012 Catholic Appeal, which supports the 50 ministries in the Archdiocese of Boston. Your gift to the Appeal is an expression of love and a testament to your faith in Jesus Christ. Jane St. Clair's mother, father and sister all died of cancer. She spent weeks with them as they were cared for in hospice. Jane drew on these painful experiences to write *Walk Me to Midnight*. “*Thirty Logical Reasons to Vote Against Assisted Suicide Laws*” from which the following excerpts are taken, came out during the 2008 election cycle. In these, Jane St. Clair presents non-religious arguments against legalizing assisted suicide.

Some terminally ill people recover and get well.

A hospice nurse told me about a lovely 24-year-old given three months to live. Five years later, she is still with us and the mother of a child.

Every good doctor knows that medicine is an art as well as a science. No one can predict with 100% certainty who will love and who will die. Although it is rare, some terminally ill people can and do get better. Everyone who works in hospice can tell you at least one story attesting to that. They personally knew a patient who beat the odds and is still vertical today.

Offer them suicide and you take everything away from them. You take away hope. You take away their lives.

Dying people can be treated for depression.

Many people who are terminally ill are not depressed. At the end of her life, my sister became like a poet or artist, sitting outside and just taking in the beauty of everything. She got an enhanced sense of life, everything became so incredibly beautiful to her because it was not going to last very much longer. However, some terminally ill people are depressed and talk about suicide. If they get antidepressant medications, a good psychologist and a caring spiritual counselor, they can recover emotionally. They often find the courage to face the final work of dying: reconciliations, settling of old disputes, telling others how much they have meant to them, and so forth. Suicide is always an act of despair, and it's not good to leave the planet in despair.


