What It Means To Celebrate The Liturgy

Part VII - The Closing Rites

Just as we wouldn't quickly leave from a dinner invitation when we have finished eating, so too our celebration of the liturgy needs a kind of "leave-taking" also. After all have had the opportunity to share in the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation, we pause for a couple of moments of quiet prayer of thanksgiving. We thank God for the gift of the Eucharist which nourishes our lives and strengthens us in faith. We thank God for this gathered assembly with whom we have shared Word and Sacrament. Then, the priest invites us to come together one last time as he says "Let us pray". Again, the priest "collects" our prayers and offers them to God, as we respond "Amen" – making the prayer our own.

Announcements or Community Notes may be made known to all, and then a blessing is prayed upon our lives. In this service of blessing, while the community is gathered, it is appropriate to offer a special blessing for community members celebrating a special anniversary, or it may be the perfect opportunity to celebrate the Anointing of the Sick with an ill community member, or to bless the young children preparing for sacraments, or something similar. Then God's blessing is invoked on all of us. This is so because we must now go forth – fed and nourished – to live our faith and be the Body of Christ in our world. It is only with God's blessing and the blessing and prayer of the community that we can accomplish this. We realize that we are not alone in the challenge of being a holy people. We all are sent forth "to love and serve the Lord, and one another". We sing the closing song, and then say our good-by's to each other already knowing that we will need to do this again, soon. The challenges are great, the blessings and support are there. Thanks Be To God.

Over the next few weeks we will run some explanatory material relating to the introduction of a New Sacramentary (Book) of Prayer that will become the official prayer book of the English speaking world of the Roman Catholic Church starting the First Sunday of Advent, 2011.

This new Prayer Book, a literal translation of the Latin text (the official language of the Church) involves new wording for all of the prayers that the priest prays at Mass, and also of the community responses during the Mass.

Scripture Study: Would you like to spend more time understanding the Word of God? Would you like to gain a deeper understanding of the Scriptures? Scripture study combines personal Bible reading and study (using materials from the Little Rock Scripture Study, a Catholic Scripture study program from the Diocese of Little Rock), small group discussion and lectures. No experience or prior study is necessary. Everyone is welcome! **The group will meet monthly, on the third Wednesday of the month 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm. First meeting started on Wednesday, October 19th.** Space is still available.
