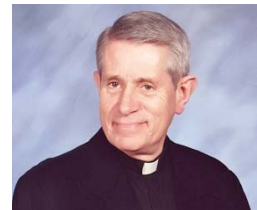

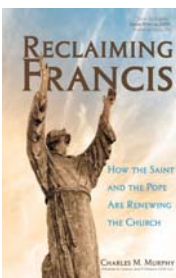

Pope Francis looks to St. Francis and the renewal he achieved in the Church of his time for inspiration today. The principal themes are: necessity of personal witness, focus upon the Cross, the beauty of the Gospel, mercy and forgiveness, and simplicity of life.

Charles M. Murphy is Director of the Diaconate for the Diocese of Portland, Maine, and former Rector of the North American College, Rome. He is the author of seven books, most recently *The Spirituality of Fasting: Rediscovering a Christian Practice*, *Eucharistic Adoration: Meditations on the Seven Last Words of Christ*, and *Reclaiming Francis: How the Saint and the Pope Are Renewing the Church*.
