I am happy to report to you what we learned about the progress of Pastoral Planning for the Archdiocese, at our recent Priest Convocation.

It is very clear to me that the Planning Commission has made every effort to listen and act upon what they have heard in the last several months. From 40 different meetings in which over 5,000 people participated, and from the parish homework pages (over 8,000 pages) so far submitted the Commission offers the following thoughts.

- There is broad-based support within the Archdiocese for moving ahead with the proposal. 84% of respondents prefer this over closing more parishes. 74% agreed that Evangelization and Outreach must be the long-term goal for mission in the Archdiocese.
- It has become abundantly clear that a phased-in approach (perhaps over a 5 year period) is the optimal way to implement the proposal.
- Assignment of pastors is a key factor, and there must be flexibility in the choosing and assigning of pastors – many factors must be considered. (This represents a big shift in the original wording of the proposal and represents what they heard at meetings.)
- Some of the proposed collaboratives do not represent the best possible groupings and will be reexamined and adjusted.
- Training for the Pastoral Service Teams is seen as absolutely critical.
- There was a realization that “one size doesn’t fit all” and that flexibility needs to be applied to this process.

The Commission also highlighted a number of concerns that they are still trying to resolve. These include: Religious Order staffed parishes, Language groups within a parish, the presence of a Catholic School in a parish, and a few other issues that need attention.

I would conclude then, at this point, that the process is moving ahead with a great deal of thoughtfulness and care. The Commission hopes to have a Proposal ready to present to the Cardinal some time this Fall.

Lastly please remember to use the resource 2012Planning.org. There you will find all the information on the development of the Planning Initiative, including the three talks that we listened to at the Convocation on June 7th. There is also a questionnaire that anyone is welcome to fill out and submit. Of course, we will continue to update you with any forthcoming information over the summer months.

This same choir led by one of our staff members, David Hadly, was asked to sing at the Copley Marriott in Boston three years ago. We have always been so proud of this choir!

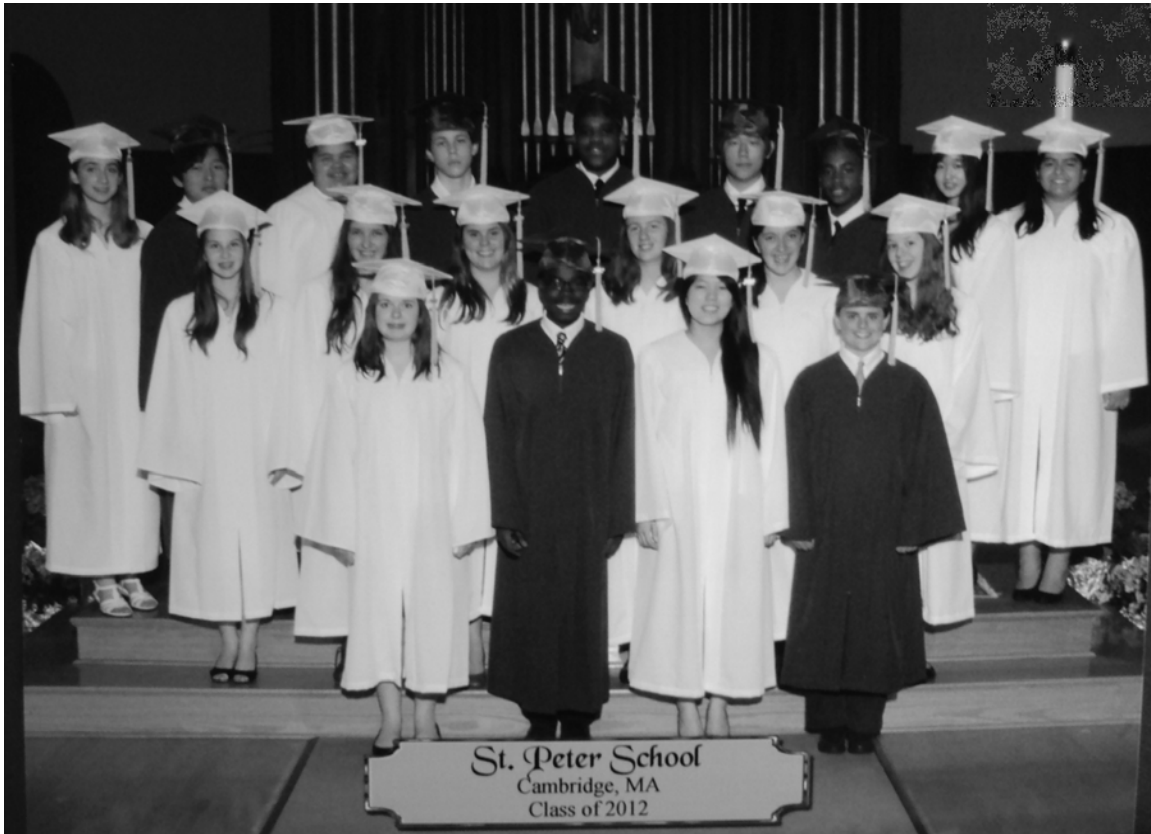
Grade 8 students also had the opportunity to perform in the amazing plays that St. Peter School has produced through the years, Lion King, Aladdin, and Les Miserables. What has always been so wonderful about these school plays is discovering the amazing talent of our children!

Also ending the school year was the K1 and K2 graduation held on June 13 at the parish center. K1 and K2 also had a very busy year learning the skills for reading and writing which are so important as they move forward to the primary grades. We are proud of how well they have progressed through these two classes.

In other classes at St. Peter School, there have also been a number of activities in addition to the curriculum. Grades 5 and 7 each attended Nature's Classroom, a three day program for grade 5 and a five day program for grade 7. At Nature's Classroom, children experience a full day of science lessons and activities, most of which are held outdoors. Grade 5 travels to Yarmouthport, Ma. for their trip and Grade 7 travels to Wakefield, Rhode Island. While there, they stay in cabins and learn some of the useful skills of camping.

The final two days of school will be June 18 and 19 and St. Peter School students will say good by for the summer to their friends from our neighboring communities, including Cambridge, but they will also say a final farewell to their friends from across the United States as well as from many international countries. St. Peter School values our visiting families and gladly welcomes them each year as they enrich the culture of the school. When we say good by to them, we hope that they will stay in touch as we also hope for all of our school children. This year, we had the amazing experience of having two students return from Chile for the week of the Washington trip so that they could experience this trip with their American friends. Truly, this shows how warm and welcoming the St. Peter School community is to all new families!
