This also means that we will not have an 8:00 a.m. Mass on Tuesdays until I can find a willing and available priest to step in.

And lastly, thank you to all who contribute to our *Air Conditioning* project. At this point just about \$24,000 has been raised. (The parish has pledged \$50,000 from parish savings and is hoping to raise the additional \$50,000 from donations.) We are moving ahead!

Poor Ladies. After her death it was called the Order of Saint Clare, more commonly known as the Poor Clares. She wrote their Rule of Life—the first monastic rule known to have been written by a woman.






RCIA
