

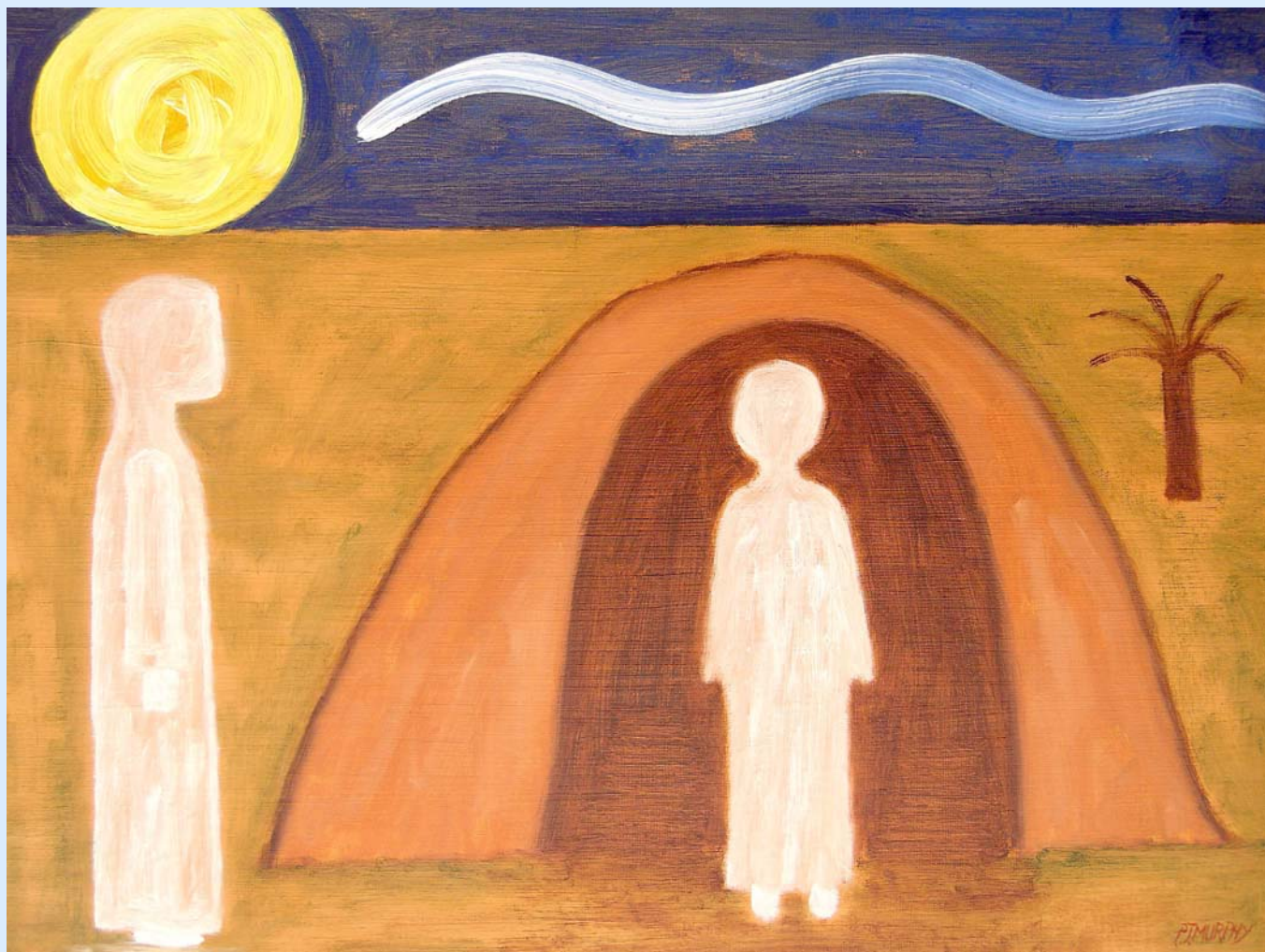

The Lenten Season is winding down. Hopefully the long season has helped us to change some behaviors and now established in us a new way of thinking and acting.

Holy Week (Palm Sunday through the beginning of the Easter Vigil) is a very special time of grace for God's People. The schedule of all services is printed in this bulletin. Please plan to set time aside each of the days to join us in prayer and worship.

After Holy Week, the Fifty Days of Celebration are upon us! Liturgically we will celebrate with joyous sharing in the sacraments of the church. At the Easter Vigil we will welcome 2 adults into the life of the church and parish through baptism. During the Easter Season we will celebrate Baptism with parish families; Confirmation with young adults; and Eucharist (for the first time) with parish children.

Meanwhile, keep up the good Lenten works.

Catholic Appeal Update

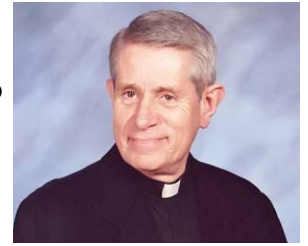
As of March 26, 2014, parishioners have contributed \$30,575 to this Appeal. This comes from 47 donors. This is a very important collection for the Archdiocese. It supports the work and outreach of the Pastoral Center. Without your help this work could not be accomplished. Our assessment this year is \$56,328 from at least 112 donors. 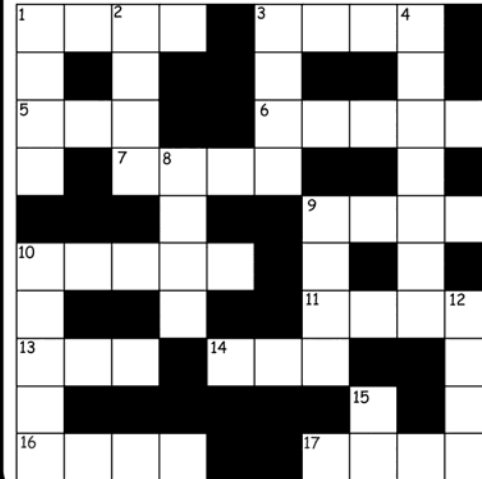

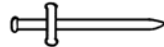

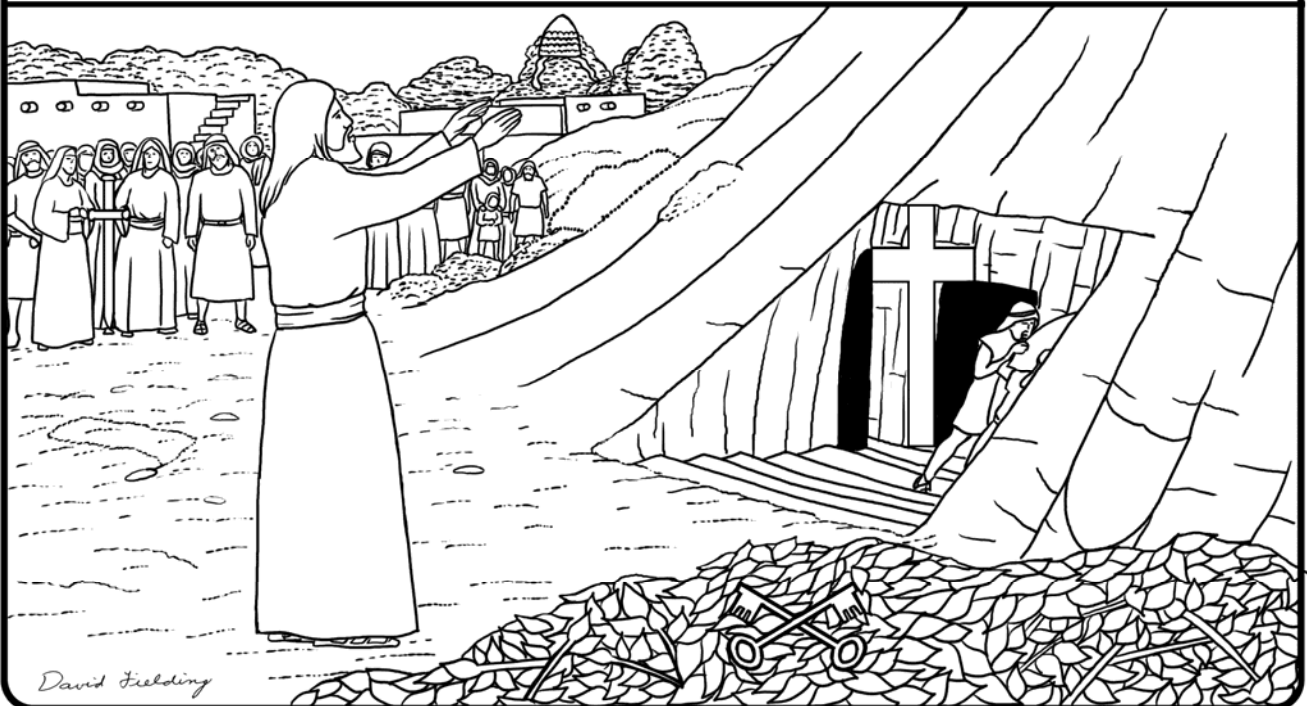
