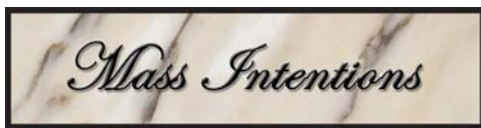

PLEASE NOTE VERY IMPORTANT !!!

Just when you think everything is all set, something happens. We all know the feeling. This is kind of like what happened to some of our summer planning.

We knew that Fr. Jim Keenan was going to be away a good part of the summer and then going on sabbatical in the Fall. Plans for coverage were in the works. Then we were surprised when Fr. Christopher Frechette discovered that he would be on sabbatical for the coming year. Back to the drawing board.

Fr. Keenan and I sat down to see what we could do. Due to many factors, including Jesuits being away on other projects, our options were not as numerous as we would have hoped.

So our solution is this: Fr. Keenan will preside at the Sunday 5:00 PM liturgy for the first four weeks of June, and Fr. O'Malley will preside at that liturgy on Sunday, June 30th. **There will be no Sunday 5:00 PM liturgy from Sunday, July 7th through the Labor Day weekend.** On the weekend of September 7/8, 2013 the regular, full mass schedule of the parish resumes. (Saturday, 4:00 PM, Sunday 8:00 and 10:00 AM, 12:00 Noon, and 5:00 PM.) Please know that full coverage of the Sunday 5:00 PM liturgy for the Fall has already been arranged.

We are sorry for any inconvenience this causes, but it is the best that we can do at this time. Thank you for your understanding.

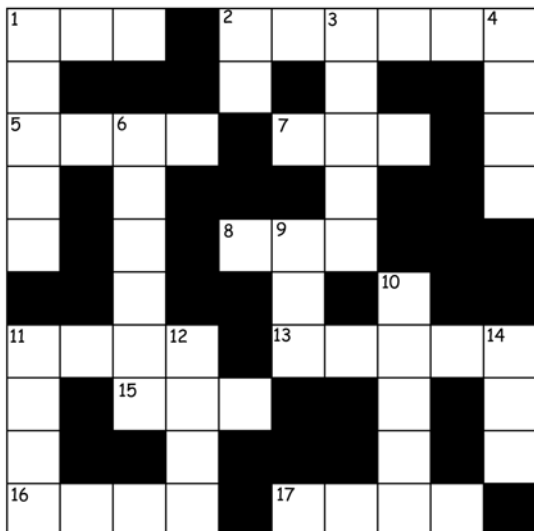
