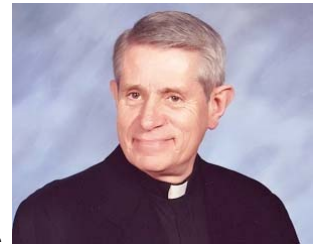

The leadership teams (staff, pastoral and finance councils) of both parishes, along with representatives of the Haitian Community of Saint John Parish met for a second time this past Wednesday at Saint Peter Parish. Working from where we left off at our last gathering at Saint John's, we spent some time exploring the "who we are and what we do" of all three groups.



After praying Evening Prayer in the Church, we gathered in the Parish Center to share information on the prayer, sacramental, activity and financial picture of both parishes. For Saint John's, this included a picture of both parish and Haitian communities; and for Saint Peter's a picture of parish and school life.

Over dinner we worked on examining possibilities of things that we could begin to do now to help parishioners better understand and be able to transition more easily to the future collaborative. A number of wonderful suggestions were raised that are both helpful and easily accomplished. With a great spirit of cooperation and enthusiasm we ended the evening with plans to meet again in the fall and work on implementing some of the suggestions.

We are very happy to help the Harvard Square Churches Meal Program again this summer. The program began in 1982 as an ecumenical ministry of ten churches in Harvard Square. It serves a nutritious sit-down dinner to over 120 people every Thursday at Christ Church, Zero Garden Street. The program attracts many college students to help set up, serve and clean up the meal. In the summer months, as the college students leave the area, the program's need for help is greater.

We are hoping St. Peter Parish can help fill this gap of volunteers this summer. Beginning on Thursday June 5th through August 28th we will send eight volunteers from St. Peter's to help. Volunteers would need to arrive between 5-5:15 p.m.. The church doors open for guests at 5:30 and dinner is served at 6 pm. Clean up is 7-7:30 p.m.

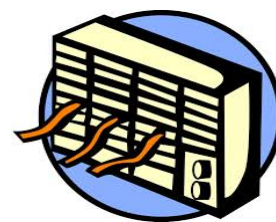

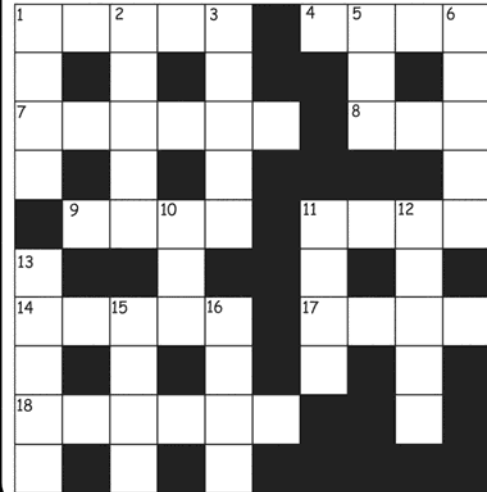
