Rev. Daniel J. Harrington, SJ (1940-2014)

Fr. Dan Harrington, a great friend to St. Peter Parish, died on February 7th at the Campion Center in Weston. He was an eminent scholar, author and professor of sacred scripture at Boston College's School of Theology and Ministry. Fr. Dan was born in Arlington and attended St. Agnes Grammar School, where he was taught by the Sisters of St. Joseph. He won a full academic scholarship to Boston College High School where he also played hockey and baseball. Citing his positive experience with his Jesuit teachers, he chose to enter the Society of Jesus upon graduation and was in the first class of novices to enter the Jesuit Novitiate in Gloucester in 1958. He was ordained in 1971 at St. Ignatius Church – in the very shadow of Boston College – and after serving as a professor of sacred scripture at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Illinois, became a faculty member at Weston Jesuit School of Theology in 1972. Fr. Dan's five decades as a Jesuit was also marked by his pastoral service to the faithful. Every Sunday for more than 42 years, he celebrated Mass at St. Agnes Parish in his hometown of Arlington. He also presided at the noon Sunday Mass at St. Peter's for more than 20 years. Fr. Dan delighted in telling fellow Jesuits that a parishioner once said to him, "You know I used to think you were boring until I started listening to you."



Fr. Dan's funeral mass was celebrated on the 12th at St. Ignatius Church. He was buried the next day at the Campion Center. He is survived by his brother Edward, of Braintree, Mass.
