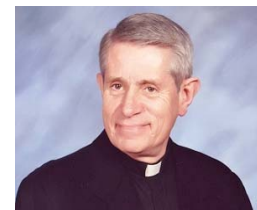

From the Pastor's Desk

Grand Annual letters have been mailed to all registered parish members. This is an important collection that will enable us to meet our expenses, and your generosity is greatly appreciated. Additional request letters are available at the doors of the church.

Also, please note the Thank You note from Cardinal Seán included in this bulletin. The generosity of St. Peter parishioners not only met our Catholic Appeal 2014 goal, but also gained us about \$13,000 in rebates to the parish. (As of September 30, 2014 the Catholic Appeal has raised \$12,981,140 from 47,400 donors in the Archdiocese of Boston. So far, 165 parishes have exceeded their parish goal and received a parish rebate.)

Scripture Study: Book of Isaiah Wednesdays Beginning October 29th



Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: “Here I am!”

Some of the most hopeful images we have in Scripture come from the Book of Isaiah. Join us as we learn about our ancestors in faith, their struggles, hopes and vision for the future. We will begin this fall for a seven-week study of the first part of the Book of Isaiah. This coming Lent we will complete the study in a six-week study. **No previous scripture study experience is needed – all are truly welcome.** We will use materials from the Little Rock Scripture Study program (a reader and a study guide) and a Bible. There is a reading assignment and reflection questions each week. We will spend our time together discussing Scripture, the discussion questions and listening to an audio lecture. The study will meet on Wednesdays, 7-8:30 p.m. in the Parish Center, October 29 – December 17 (no meeting on November 26). 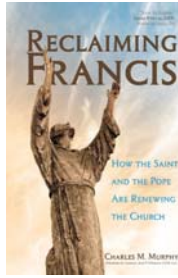

Mary in the New Testament Lectures Sunday November 2nd and 9th, 10:15 AM Parish Center

Mary, the mother of Jesus, is one of the most fascinating biblical figures. Join us as we learn more about her in a two-part lecture. Part One, on November 2nd, looks at Mary in the Gospel of Luke and Acts of the Apostles. Part Two, on November 9th, explores Mary in the Gospel of John. Both lectures are presented by *Celia Sirois*, an adjunct professor of Sacred Scripture at Theological Institute for the New Evangelization at St John's Seminary.

Dear Friends in Christ:


Every day, I am inspired by the immense generosity of spirit at work in our Archdiocese of Boston.
